GCSE Results:

13 students achieved grade 9 - equivalent to A*

15 students achieved grade 8 - equivalent to A

13 students achieved grade 7 - equivalent to A

16 students achieved grade 6 - equivalent to B

12 students achieved grade 5 - equivalent to C

1 students achieved grade 4 - equivalent to C

A Level Results:

14 students achieved 9s - equivalent to A*

13 students achieved 8s - equivalent to A

15 students achieved 6s - equivalent to B

4 students achieved 5s - equivalent to C

Here are some measures we will be considering during the sessions (Information taken from Department for Education)

Essential measures include:

- a requirement that people who are ill stay at home
- robust hand and respiratory hygiene
- enhanced cleaning arrangements
- active engagement with NHS Test and Trace
- formal consideration of how to reduce contacts and maximise distancing between those in school wherever possible and minimise potential for contamination so far as is reasonably practicable
- How contacts are reduced will depend on the school's circumstances and will (as much as possible) include:
- avoiding contact between groups
- arranging classrooms with forward facing desks
- staff maintaining distance from pupils and other staff as much as possible

All staff at GNKC have worked tirelessly to get all the resources ready in time for when the school re opens and make sure all classrooms are equipped with sanitiser stations following advice from the Department of Education.
